Events & Programmes Conducted

9TH MULTIMEDIA CAMPAIGN AWARENESS PROGRAMME

The NSACS (Nagaland State AIDS Control Society) in collaboration with DAPCU (District AIDS Prevention and Control Unit) organised the 9th Multimedia Campaign Awareness through Music on 15th November, 2019 to promote awareness, compassion, education and support for HIV/AIDS. Nine students from Baptist College, Kohima attended the programme at State Academy Hall under the theme "Know Your HIV Status. Get Tested and Treated".

2nd NATIONAL NATUROPATHY DAY

Nagaland State Ayushman Mission Society (NSAMS) observed 2nd National Naturopathy Day on the occasion of the 150th birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi under the theme "Mahatma Gandhi and Nature Cure" on 18th November, 2019 at Malo-o Indoor Stadium, Chedema, Kohima. Shri R. Ramakhrishnan, IAS, Principal Secretary H&FW, Govt. of Nagaland was the Special Guest. Thirty NSS members from 6th Semester Baptist College, Kohima Campus along with Programme Officer, Ms. Naro attended the programme. The event concluded with activities such as sunbath and bare foot walking.

- 3. Evaluating the problems of solid waste management.

Section B (B.Com)

- 1. Aquatic Ecosystem in the river.
- 2. Observe and document the hill slope, soil, water courses and other characteristics.
- 3. Medicinal plants: Identify the varieties and their uses.

The students were asked to gather information for the project from the visited spot. The lecturers-in-charge for the trip were Dr. Sentinaro, Dr. Tsenbeni Kennao, Ms. Asola C. Jamir, Mr. Kezhalelhou Zatsu, Mr. Thsidilong and Mr. Hiamthuiyang James. The day ended with sight-seeing, sharing lunch boxes and group photos.


