## Report on Career Guidance, Counseling and Motivation

A seminar on career guidance, counseling and motivation was conducted for the students of Baptist College, Sechü Campus under the theme, "Towards the Zenith of Success" by Career Guidance and Counseling Committee to mould the students, to guide them to choose the right profession and how to achieve it.

The seminar started with a word of prayer from Asst. Prof. Peter Maram. Upon completing the prayer, the first session began with Dr. Zavise Rume, Associate Prof. SCERT as the resource person. The topic under the session was on 'How to choose the right profession'. He shared on how a career in the real sense is a process of progression and emphasized on a person's profession which must click on one's interest. Stressing on the need to explore the many resources within a person to help channelize those resources towards developing a career, he quoted, "Man is born with multiple talents, but you yourself is the best source of information for yourself". He also stressed on the need for skill based career.

Followed by the second session with Shri. Rukewelo Mero, Superintendent of Police, Peren where he spoke on the topic 'Motivation and Aptitude'. On the onset he requested the student generation not to play a blame game and that each student is responsible for his own learning and development. He pointed out at the lack of purpose, goal, failure of practical application of knowledge while studying and the sole aim to get paper qualification as some major mistakes that can hinder us from achieving success. He also briefed on technologies and its abuse and how its excessive use is adversely affecting the mind- set of the young generation in the present scenario. 
## Yuva Shakti Rally flagged off in Kohima


Bapco Focus October 2018
