



The fourth edition of Literature Fest was held on the 10th August 2019, organized by the department of English, Baptist College Kohima in collaboration with Backstage Campaign and the event participants: ILANDLO, DVS Publishers, Eastern Book House, BEADY BITS, NIVEDITA, PENTHRILL and CROSSWORD. The event was divided into different sessions. The first session was held at Rivenburgs Memorial Hall at 10 am opening with a prayer by Mr. Lhouyii Dolie, introduction by Dr. Tsenbeni, followed by the principal's address and a song by the 3rd semester students of English department.

The event also consisted of Photo Booth by the 5th semester students of English department and various competitions such as Meme competition, Poetry writing, Pencil sketching and creative workshops like T. V Journalism which was conducted by Ms. Loreni Tsanglao, Reporter of News 18 Assam/Northeast; Painting by Mr. Avikuo Tepa, Artist/Entrepreneur, Proprietor of Headlight & Capital Art Center, Institute of Fine Arts; Entrepreneurship by Mr. Lichan Humtsoe, Founder & CEO of Ete coffee; Music by Mr. Petez Newmai, Performing musician, composer, vocal instructor of Symphony Academy of Music; Videography by Mr. Sanen Kichu, Cinematographer, Editor, Musician, proprietor of San production and co-founder of Rec. Urrent; Writing by Ms. Rita Krocha, poet, journalist, author, and founder of Penthrill Publication House; Photography by Mr. SuchamayangKichu, Life member, Persona-International "The Home of Image Makers" proprietor, NOKSA "The House of Image and Framing".

Besides creative workshops, there was a Book fair where the participants were, CROSSWORD: Kohima, PENTHRILL PUBLICATION HOUSE: Kohima, ILANDLO: First online shopping platform in Northeast, DVS PUBLISHERS: Guwahati, EASTERN BOOK HOUSE(EBH): Guwahati, NIVEDITA: Guwahati, KAMAKHYA BOOK AGENCY: Guwahati. Various craft stalls by BEADY BITS, WULO AKAMI ARTWORKS and our student's craft stalls. Other departments like Political Science and History also set up food stalls.

After the competitions and workshops were held, there was a meet and interactive session with Sentilong Ozukum, author of *Campus Blues & Sincerely Yours* who talked and shared his views about the book from the author's perspective. Last but not the least, the open mic session was held where students or rather aspiring artists from our own college as well as other colleges shared their thoughts, writings and songs with the audience. This session provided an opportunity to everyone to showcase their talents and a platform to perform. The event concluded with the declaration of results of the various competitions and distribution of certificates and lastly a vote of thanks from the HOD, Dr. Sentinaro.

My Experience of Attending a National Seminar

I was privileged to attend the Two Day National Seminar on "KELHOU ZHO - CULTURAL HERITAGE AMONG THE TRIBES OF NAGALAND: BALANCING TRADITION AND MODERNITY", organised by Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts, North East Regional Centre, Guwahati (IGNCA-NERC) and Culture Study Centre, Baptist College, Kohima which was held on the 24th and 25th of September 2019 at Baptist College, Kohima Campus. It was a great eye opener, and has greatly benefited and enlightened me in learning more about our culture vis-a-vis modernity. The seminar not only helped me in learning about the concept and importance of culture but has also brought forth many new thoughts and challenges from which culture and modernity can be viewed.


The topics covered by the various researchers and scholars through the papers presented were the most apt and contemporary issues in the cultural society. Although there were many interesting topics, we could attend only one session at a time as there were parallel sessions to accommodate all the paper presenters. Among the research papers, the ones which I found most interesting and relevant were the topics on "Music: A Career Prospect among School Students" by Meyetsolo Ritse, and "Refashioning Culture through Social Media" by Dr. Theyiesinuo Keditsu. Overall, the researchers were all well versed in their topics and presented their ideas clearly and to the point.

The most interesting session for me was the Panel Discussion on the topic "Naga Identity in Contemporary Society Vis-à-vis Social Media" with Dr. Theyiesinuo Keditsu, Asst. Professor of English, Kohima College as the moderator and Dr. Visakhonu Hibo, Principal, Japfu Christian College, Mr. Tiakumzuk Aier, Director, Dreamz Unlimited and Ms. Wekoweu Tsuhah, Director, North East Network, Nagaland as the panel speakers. Since the topic is very relevant to what the contemporary society is facing, I found this discussion to be an important way of finding solutions to our issues. The Film Screening & Discussion session also showed that there is a way of preserving and continuing the past tradition and keeping it alive through documentation.

Our Naga society may have gone through various changes but there still are some rays of light which enable us to come together and bring solutions to the various challenges that lie ahead. The varied topics have enriched us and brought to our understanding the existing and new measures to look into the culture vis-a-vis modernity. I learned that we can use social media as a platform to promote our culture and document them.

The seminar was well organised. It has not only been helpful in studying and understanding our culture but it has also acted as a 'bank' which has loaned me greatly in understanding the cultural aspects and also in balancing modernity with culture. It would be appreciated if the college holds such programs or seminars annually, or even the Cultural Day annually, as it would gradually trigger in the minds of the students an awareness of the cultural perspectives, to uphold, preserve, or promote; to think about our culture and identity seriously. Students keep posting pictures on social media often, so such programs will enable others (non Nagas) also to get to know us better. Therefore, it will be beneficial not just for our society but universally.

Hard Times by Charles Dickens is set in the age of Industrial Revolution, when industrialists made their fortune while the laborers who worked for them and slaved in dangerous and unhealthy conditions. Hard Times is partly a critique of a political and economical movement that was taking England by storm In the 1850s, and partly a demonstration of Dickens' belief that children need wonder in their lives.

He also bashes both sides in the corruption-contest between organized labor and their industrialist employers, and lambasts the unjust system that made divorce legal only for the rich.

Mr. Thomas Gradgrind raised his children along these strict, utilitarian lines. The results of his experiment are Louisa, who marries a blustering tycoon whom she does not love and is tempted within an inch of adultery by an immoral playboy; and Thomas Jr., also known as "the whelp" who sullenly exploits everyone for his own pleasure, and who finally brings the deepest shame and heartbreak on the family. Sissy Jupe is my favourite character because she acts as the main force for good in the novel, she is kind, caring and loving. In the force of being abandoned by her father and then being forced to learn Gradgrind's philosophy, she never stops being the grounding, emotionally positive force in Coketown.

You will pity and love Rachael and Stephen. You will loathe and despise Bounderby, Harthouse, Bitzer and Mrs. Sparsit. You will be stunned by the death scene of Mrs. Gradgrind, thrilled by the revelation of Mrs. Pegler's true identity.

Hard Times is one of Dickens shortest novels and is certainly a masterpiece . it is a must-read piece of fiction and I would strongely recommend this book for anyone who loves books as satire.


